COURSE DESCRIPTION & OBJECTIVE

DESCRIPTION:

This class will examine tort liability arising from communications, especially mass media and other public communications. This includes "communications" torts, such as defamation, invasion of privacy, infringement of the right of publicity and the application to communications of economic torts, negligence and other theories of tort liability.

OBJECTIVE:

To assist the student in developing an understanding of the fundamental principles of Media Law through study and analysis of cases, regulations and other relevant materials as well as through problem-solving exercises

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the conclusion of this course, the student should have gained (1) knowledge of the principal issues of the field and how the courts have addressed them and (2) the ability to employ recognized analytical strategies for resolving legal issues at the center of both traditional and new media.
