

COURSE DESCRIPTION & OBJECTIVE

OBJECTIVE:

To assist the student in developing an understanding of the fundamental principles and rapidly evolving landscape of Media Law. Course coverage extends from the development of the First Amendment through current and future legal issues posed by advancements in communications technologies. This course will entail the study and analysis of cases, statutes, regulations and other relevant materials used to resolve various legal issues regarding the role and function of mass media---and now social media—in the United States.
