INTRODUCTION

The library intends this guide to be a workable electronic document with active links included. The TMSL Law Library also lists its available electronic resources on two web pages:

The electronic resources offered by the TMSL Law Library fall into four types:

FREE RESOURCES:

First are the publicly available resources which are always free to anyone, anywhere, but which are useful enough that we provide links to them. These links can be used to access these resources regardless of where the user is located or who the user is.

GROUP LOGIN RESOURCES:

Second are those resources to which the library subscribes and which generally are not available to the public outside the library. Any resource of this type should be available from any computer in the law school or accessing the web via law school Wi-Fi. Additionally, most offer an option for off-campus remote access to students, faculty, and staff. In an effort to simplify remote access to these resources, the TMSL Law Library configured them for a single method of authentication.

To access databases available **via remote access**:

1. Go to the link titled "Remote Access" in this guide or at the end of the resource name on either of the web pages listed at the beginning of this guide.
2. Enter your patron username and library barcode number. You **must** obtain a barcode from the library's Circulation Desk during its operating hours before you can use remote access.
3. Contact the Technical Services Manager at 713-313-1005 if you are having trouble logging in remotely using your TMSL issued library barcode number.
4. If a resource is down or displaying an error, contact the Electronic Resources Librarian at 713-313-1107.

NOTE: Many databases are switching to "secure" https protocols. Unfortunately, at this time all https resources cannot be accessed remotely. Instead, users see a warning that the connection is not private. This currently includes: All Wolters-Kluwer Intelliconnect resources, All BNA Premier Resources, Texas Lawyer, and the Homeland Security Digital library. We apologize for any inconvenience.

INDIVIDUAL LOGIN RESOURCES:

Third are those resources to which the library or the law school subscribes which require unique individual logins and passwords to access (EX: Westlaw, Lexis Advance, etc.). Access to these resources is generally limited to TMSL students, faculty, and staff. Users should already have received login information from the respective vendors.

LIMITED LICENSE RESOURCES:

Fourth are the resources which are only available on certain computers within the library (EX: ProDoc). You must be at those computers to access these resources.

Bloomberg Law :	Bloomberg Law is similar to Westlaw and Lexis, but with a corporate and business slant including some competitive intelligence resources. It also has a docket search tool in addition to primary resource retrieval databases and limited archives of PACER. Access is limited to current students and faculty. You will need to set up your own login and password to use it, but once you do that, you can access it from anywhere you have an Internet connection. TO REGISTER: On the registration page skip the Activation Code blank at the top of the page, fill in the rest of the blanks (using your tsu email), agree to the terms, and prove you are not a robot. Bloomberg will send an email to your TSU email account. Follow the directions from there. Note: Bloomberg Law is case sensitive; put the part of your email address after the @ sign in lower case.

It also offers AUDIO FILES of oral arguments in several cases which may be of interest to students, evidence faculty, and others.
Current Index to Legal Periodicals (CILP) Emailed to faculty members	A weekly table of contents for new law review and journal issues and a subject index to the articles in these journals
Congress.gov (Successor to Thomas.gov) Free resource	The Library of Congress's web page with information on Congress and the doings of Congress. Page contains links to the Library's main page and the Copyright Office.
Constitutions of the World Remote Access	Contains current full text constitutions of 203 countries and provides introductory and comparative notes that examine recent amendments and highlights.

<u>Investment Arbitration Reporter (IAReporter)</u> <u>Remote Access</u>	An electronic news service tracking cross-border arbitrations between foreign investors and their host governments. Our reports help a broad range of readers - including lawyers, academics and government officials - stay abreast of the latest lawsuits and policy developments in the field of international investment law.
<u>JSTOR</u>	An archive of various journal articles. NOTE: Recent journal articles may not yet be available. Currently no remote access.
<u>The Judicial Appointments Database</u> Free resource	The Judicial Appointments Database is database containing data about thousands of state and federal judges and judicial appointors such as governors and presidents. Information includes biographical data about each person, the roles they have held before, during and after their time in the judicial branch, their political affiliations, their education, and any retention events that kept them in a judicial position (such as a reappointment).
<u>Law360</u> <u>Remote Access</u>	Law360 is a subscription based, daily, legal news service from LexisNexis covering most practice areas.

<u>National Center for Interstate Compacts Database</u>	CSG's National Center for Interstate Compacts Database allows you to search more than 1,500 statutes for state-by-state interstate compact membership, serving as a useful search tool for researching interstate compacts. Free database.
<u>NatLaw World</u> <u>Remote Access</u>	Collection of Latin American and Mexican legislation and regulatory materials. Legislation is organized by country and subject matter. This used to be called InterAm Database.

<p><u>O'Connor's Online</u></p>	<p>Online access to a collection of practice-related Texas materials used by practicing attorneys all across the state. Access limited to current students and faculty.</p> <p>You will have to register the first time you visit the site.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NOTE: You will need your official TSU email address to register and to verify your account. • NOTE: Logins are case-sensitive; the part after the '@' sign must be in lower case. • NOTE: Once you have created your account, you should be able to access this from home without using our remote access protocols.

<p><u>ProQuest History Vault</u> <u>Remote Access</u></p>	<p>Primary source materials from ProQuest's University Publications of America (UPA) Collection in a digital format. Currently, we subscribe to the Southern Life & Slavery portion consisting of three modules: Slavery and the Law and two modules of Southern Life and African American History, 1775-1915, Plantations Records.</p>
<p><u>Ravel Law</u> Free resource</p>	<p>Ravel is a legal research platform that has access to basic case material courtesy of a digitization effort in conjunction with the Harvard Law Library and other public record sources. This material is available and searchable for free. Ravel also provides data analytics related to judges, courts, and other aspects of the law. Those are NOT free. To gain the free access you simply need to go to the page linked here and then make an account.</p>
<p><u>RECAP</u> Free resource</p>	<p>RECAP is an add on for Firefox and Chrome browsers designed to help alleviate the costs associated with using PACER to access federal case documents. When you are in PACER, it connects to an archive where people have donated .pdf copies of documents they have pulled from PACER. If a copy of your document is in the free archive it tells you so you do not have to pay PACER for the case, and if the case is not in the archive, it asks you to donate a copy.</p>
<p><u>Reginfo.gov</u> Free resource</p>	<p>A page from the Executive Office of the President that offers data about federal regulation, including the Unified Agenda.</p>

<u>Regulations.gov</u> Free resource	A federal government web page for viewing and commenting on proposed regulations.
<u>Robert J. Terry Library Databases</u>	Texas Southern University's main campus has an A-Z list of Electronic Databases available to TSU/TMSL students, faculty, and staff. These electronic resources are available on campus and from home. To access the databases from home, click on a database from the Electronic Databases A-Z list. When you are prompted, enter your T-number and last name into the specified spaces. Please contact 713-313-7402 if you need help accessing any of the listed databases.

<u>Technical Report Archive and Image Library (TRAIL)</u>	The Technical Report Archive & Image Library (TRAIL) identifies, acquires, catalogs, digitizes and provides unrestricted access to U.S. government agency technical reports. Free database.
<u>TexasLawHelp.org</u> Free resource	This website is dedicated to providing free, reliable legal information to low-income Texans. It is part of a broader effort within the national legal aid community to use technology, specifically the Internet, to enhance and expand the delivery of legal aid. THIS SITE HAS FORMS.
<u>Texaslawyer.com</u> <u>Remote Access</u>	The online version of the Texas Lawyer, which has been a key source of legal news and information to the legal community in Texas for more than twenty years. This site offers good browsing and search functionality, but articles are also included in Lexis. Accessing older articles may require using Lexis.
<u>The Texas State Law Library</u> Free resource for Texans Does not work from TSU	The Texas State Law Library is a free resource for anyone residing in Texas. You will need to sign up for an account with them and let them geolocate you in order to determine your eligibility for their resources, but once you do, they provide access to HeinOnline, FastCase, AILALink, and other legal reference databases. They also provide access to various legal e-books. However, due to the firewalls at TSU, you cannot access this resource from on campus. NOTE: You must renew your membership in this library every SIX months and prove your Texas residence at that time via geolocation.

<u>Thomson Reuters Checkpoint</u> No Remote Access	An online service dedicated to tax law. It includes the Federal Tax Coordinator, Internal Revenue Code, Regulations with commentary and standard tax treatises. (Used to be RIA Checkpoint)
<u>Westlaw</u> Accessible remotely with normal Westlaw login	Comprehensive database containing statutes, cases, law journal articles, news. Contact the Electronic Resources Librarian about getting a password. Students, faculty, and staff only.
