Khamisie Green is a second-year law student from Odessa, Texas. Before attending law school, Khamisie had an 8-year career in higher education focusing on Student Affairs, Housing, and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI).

During the 2023–24 academic year, Khamisie served as Vice-President of the Barbara C. Jordan Chapter - Black Law Students Association at Thurgood Marshall School of Law, on the campus of Texas Southern University. In March 2024, he attended the 56th National Black Law Students Association (“NBLSA”) Convention held in Houston, Texas—themed, “We’ve Got Work to Do: No Fear, No Limits” and vied for the position of National Vice Chair.

Khamisie was the underdog going into the elections, having no service at the regional level, nor receiving any regional endorsements. His opponent, a second-year law student from Texas A&M University, was armed with Harvard and UVA degrees. Khamisie garnered unanimous support from BLSA chapter delegates not only at his opponent’s schools, but nearly all others represented at the convention. Additionally, he presented a speech to the General Assembly encompassing hundreds of Black law students from law schools nationwide. By an overwhelming majority, Khamisie was elected to serve as the **57th National Vice Chair of NBLSA**.

In this prestigious role, Khamisie will oversee NBLSA’s 6,000+ membership, 6 regions, 126+ chapters, and national chapters in Ghana and the United Kingdom. As National Vice Chair, his overarching platform encompasses mobilization of the national organization to address issues facing DEI and overall improve the experience of Black law students, nationally.

Post law school, Khamisie endeavors a career as a trial attorney, with ambition to ultimately pursue a federal judge appointment.
