

ASSOCIATE JUSTICE HENRY EMAN DOYLE 1910-1985

HENRY EMAN DOYLE was born March 15, 1910 to Mr. Albert Doyle and Mary Burleson Doyle in Austin, Texas.

He attended the public school there and graduated in the 1928 class of Anderson High School. He received his Bachelors Degree from Samuel Huston College and taught in the Austin public school system and did graduate study at Columbia University. Thereafter, he enrolled in Texas Southern University's School of Law and became its first graduate in 1950, having previously been admitted to the Texas State Bar in 1949.

For twenty-seven years Judge Doyle engaged in the general practice of law, including service as legal counsel for the Houston Chapter of the NAACP. In 1977 Judge Doyle was appointed to the bench of Houston Municipal Court No. 6. On December 1, 1978 he was appointed as an Associate Justice of the First Court of Appeals of Texas. He retired from the bench on December 31, 1984. He had a long and distinguished career in the legal profession. Judge Doyle will always be remembered for his unselfishness and zest for living and the law.

He was a member of numerous professional organizations, including the Houston Lawyer's Association, Houston Bar Association, State Bar of Texas, American Judicature Society, National Bar Association, American Bar Association, and American Judges Association. Judge Doyle was a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and Brown Chapel A.M.E. Church.

Judge Doyle is survived by his wife, Vendya M. Doyle, son, Vernon Henry Doyle, three sisters, a host of nieces and nephews, and numerous devoted friends.
