Jide James-Eluyode is an Assistant Professor of Law at the Texas Southern University Thurgood Marshall School of Law. Prior to joining Thurgood Marshall School of Law, Prof. James-Eluyode was a Visiting Assistant Professor of Law at the University of Tulsa College of Law. He also, at various times, served as a faculty member in the MA Program in Social Justice and Human Rights at the Arizona State University's School of Social and Behavioral Sciences, and as a Senior Fellow and Post-doctoral Fellow at the University of Arizona James E. Rogers College of Law.

Professor James-Eluyode's teaching and scholarly work lie at the intersection of business and human rights, law of contract, international energy & natural resources law, corporate social responsibility and ethics, indigenous peoples' rights, and international economic development law. Prof. James-Eluyode has authored several articles and delivered numerous lectures on these highlighted subject areas.
