#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Juvenile law is a (2) two credit course (fall) which is designed to provide students with a complete and comprehensive understanding of juvenile law and the juvenile criminal justice system. This course will explore various topics impacting issues relevant to Juvenile Law.
