Relley L. Austin currently serves as the Associate Director of the Center for Civil Advocacy at the Earl Carl Institute for Legal & Social Policy. In this capacity, Mrs. Austin supervises the Opal Mitchell Lee Property Preservation Project which provides free legal services to low-income Texans who are facing potential land loss by helping economically disadvantaged communities to retain and grow wealth and to ensure housing stability.
